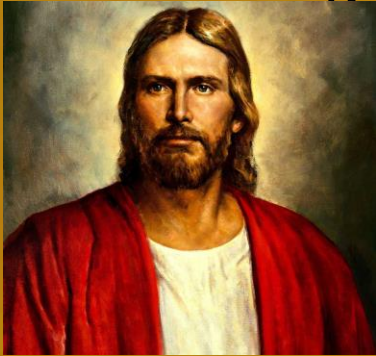


GLORIOUS
